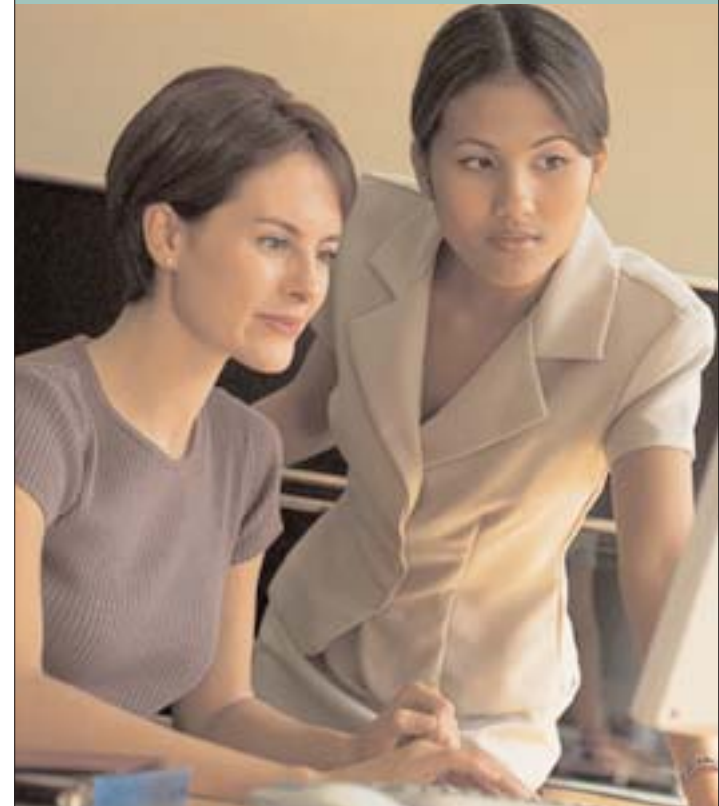


The Women's Resource Center is located on the corner of Summit Avenue and Yanceyville Street, close to downtown Greensboro.

INFORMATION GATEWAY

COMMUNITY RESOURCE COUNSELORS

As your first point of contact, a WRC Community Resource Counselor is a trained volunteer who will listen supportively and assist you in developing a game plan, one that will make full use of community services and WRC services. 60-minute individual resource counseling sessions are free, available to women 18 and over (3 sessions per quarter). LEGAL INFORMATION AND REFERRALS

Free 15-minute phone consultation with an attorney in the following areas of law: financial, divorce/child custody, landlord/tenant, immigration, employment, civil, criminal, business, healthcare, employment, bankruptcy, and more. COMMUNITY RESOURCE ROOM

Brochures, booklets, and handouts representing over 400 agencies designed to assist those in need. Resource room also includes extensive educational packets about legal issues affecting women (available in both English and Spanish).

TRAINING/WORKSHOPS

EMPLOYMENT

New Choices – Strategies for Success: A series of pre-employment workshops to build self-esteem and employment skills, specifically for homemakers returning to the workforce and underemployed single mothers needing additional training. Topics covered include resume writing, interviewing, budgeting, time management, identifying career goals, networking, and more. Childcare, transportation, and educational stipends are available to those who meet eligibility requirements.

Self Esteem – A monthly 4-part workshop series on self-esteem issues for women is offered during both day and evening hours.

Other Workshops – Community educational workshops provide information on various topics of interest and concern such as child support collection, health matters, household budgeting, and more.

OTHER SERVICES

TRANSPORTATION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM

The Guilford County Department of Transportation (DOT) partners with the WRC to provide financial assistance to those who qualify for coverage of a portion of car repair bills, insurance payments, and gas vouchers. Recipients must be full-time workers (30+ hours per week) and meet income requirements.

FACILITIES

Meeting rooms are available to community groups for a nominal fee.

FAQ FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: What is the Women's Resource Center?

A: *WRC is a place where women can receive information about the services available in our community, along with education, advice, and support from caring staff and volunteers. We are a non-profit United Way Agency created and operated by women for women. The WRC is here because we all face difficult periods "go it alone."*

Q: How do I know the WRC is the right place for me?

A: *We help women from all across our community and from all walks of life. Change is one thing we all have in common; it is the nature of life. Whether you are dealing with divorce, starting a new career, caring for a loved one, or coping with just about any of life's other challenges, you will find the help you need at the WRC.*

Q: What do I do if I think I need help?

A: *The first step is to call, email or walk in to make an appointment with a WRC Community Resource Counselor. She and you will talk privately and come up with a game plan to deal with your particular situation.*

Q: What is the WRC's most popular service?

A: *The Community Resource Counseling program is most widely used because it connects women to vital community services and resources.*

Q: Do I have to become a member in order to access Women's Resource Center services?

A: *The Women's Resource Center is not a membership organization; our services are available to all women in our community, over the age of 18, and most programs are free of charge.*

Q: Does the WRC need my help?

A: *Yes! The WRC welcomes contributions, volunteers, and student interns. We are a non-profit United Way agency; our work is funded by grants, and individual and corporate donations. In addition, volunteers are a cornerstone of the support services we offer; each year WRC depends on thousands of volunteer hours to provide our services.*
